

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Welcome to 2008

Welcome to students, parents and guardians and other community members to the 2008 school year. In particular, a warm welcome is offered to our Year 7 students and other new students.

This year promises to be an exciting one in the life of Lilydale High School. Some of our current projects include:

- The new Arts wing is completely finished and classes will begin there in Week 2.
- Work will begin shortly on extensions to the ICT centre. Two new rooms will house new facilities for media, music and photography.
- The music and drama departments have been relocated to a renovated Performing Arts Centre in the old technology wing on the western boundary of the school. This provides better performance and practice spaces.
- Information and Communication technology classrooms are now housed in the building near the Williams St gate. This has enabled better servicing and coordination of our ICT facilities.
- Development of the recreation spaces and gardens is proceeding well. Rainwater tanks are soon to be installed to catch all the water from the basketball stadium to provide irrigation for the main oval.
- Much more extensive use of the school's learning management system is planned for 2008 and will mean much greater parent and guardian access to curriculum and administrative information relevant to students on a daily basis.
- Work will continue on our two main priorities of improving VCE performance and reviewing curriculum in the middle years.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

2008 TRAVEL CONCESSION CARDS PHOTOS

A professional photographer will be available at Lilydale High School on **Tuesday 12 February** at **12.20pm** to provide instant colour photos as required for the 2008 Student Travel Concession Cards. The current cards expire at the end of February, after which students must have new cards in order to obtain the P.T.C. Student Concession Rate.

The **cost** for a set of two professionally taken colour portraits is **\$6 payable to the photographs at the photo session**. The photos will be processed on the spot and returned immediately to the student. Portrait Quality Photos are guaranteed by the photographer who will be using studio quality lighting and equipment.

EDUCATION MAINTENANCE ALLOWANCE

A reminder, EMA application forms must be submitted to the school by **29 February 2008** for the first payment and 1 August 2008 for the second payment.

The EMA provides an annual amount of **\$430** for secondary students and is paid in two instalments. **\$150.50** is paid to both the school and parents for the first instalment and **\$64.50** each for the second instalment.

In order to keep up with new work, students should endeavour to set aside 5 to 10 minutes a night to memorise vocabulary.

All Year 7 students will be tested for Mathematical ability during week one of this term. This will allow us to establish which students may need extra assistance in Mathematics. Once identified, parents will be contacted and these students will receive extra assistance.

Catch Up Classes

Catch Up will run twice weekly throughout the term. Tuesday and Thursday lunchtimes have been allocated for these sessions. They will be open to all students and will provide an opportunity for extra tuition and assistance. Please encourage your child/ren to make the most of these classes throughout the year.

YEAR 7

Great start for Year 7, 2008

On Wednesday 30 January our Year 7 students completed their first day of high school. It was good to see everyone arrive on time and happily move off with their form teacher to their home room. At lunchtime we all met for a hotdog and an icy pole, after which many Year 7 students wandered off to explore their new environment. Thanks to all of the parents who joined us for the lunch; it was the first opportunity of many, for us to get together.

On Thursday and Friday the Year 7 students were allocated lockers, and by the end of the week the lockers were stacked with books and ready for serious study in the weeks ahead. To ensure the smooth transition into high school continues, we ask that students and parents carefully consider the following points.

Naming all belongings

Please make sure that all books, clothing items and other items are clearly labelled with your name and form group. We ask students to take particular care with their books and belongings and to not bring any valuable items to school.

Lockers

We have asked all Year 7 students to make sure that they DO NOT GIVE ANYONE THEIR LOCKER COMBINATIONS. The lockers are a safe place for books and we encourage them to keep their locker space confidential so that it remains in a place that only they can access.

Folders – Setting them up

In the booklet, which was distributed to all Year 7 students on Orientation day, there was a section in the back explaining how to set up folders. Please refer to this to ensure books and folders are set up correctly from the start. Form teachers will be monitoring folders throughout the year to ensure they remain organised and tidy. Being organised is one of the keys to a successful year.

Hats - Sunsmart

We strongly encourage students to ensure that they apply sunscreen in the morning and then throughout the day whilst at school for those times when they are involved in outdoor activities. We also encourage the wearing of a hat at lunchtime and recess through the summer months. In Physical and Sport Education classes (PASE), it is essential that a hat be worn when participating in outdoor sporting pursuits.

'Getting it Right' Program – Week 3

During Week 3 all Year 7 students will be participating in the "Getting It Right" program which involves providing important information to students about the schools Code of Conduct and Anti Harassment policies. Some time is spent in goal setting and organising folders and lockers to assist with their organization for high school. We also extend a warm invitation to all parents and guardians to spend the morning with us to view the information sessions and partake in some morning tea with the teachers.
