CURRICULUM NEWS

3 Way Conferences and Digital Portfolios

On September 18 the 3 Way Conference Day/Evening took place. Year 7-10 students, under the guidance of their assigned teacher, showcased, via their digital portfolio, their work. This involved a student led discussion about;

- The student's personalised learning goals
- The strategies through which the student strived to achieve those learning goals
- Showcasing of a collection of either hard or electronic evidence aimed at demonstrating the measurable progress which was made by the student. The day was a huge success!

NAPLAN results and tuition available

Parents have now received the Naplan 2008 Reporting Package. The report included;

- A covering letter
- Confidential student report for the school which is distributed to parents/guardians
- Reporting guide which provides information about the NAPLAN Data Service and instructions on how to access the data (The NAPLAN Data Service can be located through the web link on the front page of the VCAA website at www.vcaa.vic.edu.au)
- Information pamphlet for parents

Parent reports include information such as;

- Individual student results for all NAPLAN tests on the ten-band National Achievement Scale
- An indicator for each assessment area that shows the national average and the middle 60% of national results

Tuition Available

The *An Even Start* (AES) – National Tuition Program is providing \$700 for literacy and numeracy tuition for eligible students. Eligible students are those who fell below the national benchmark in reading, writing or numeracy in the AIM testing in 2007. Relevant parents will be contacted and kept informed.

Melbourne/Monash University Extension Courses

In recent school newsletters, students and parents have been made aware of university extension programs that are available. Included in the information provided were the details regarding an Extension Program Information Evening hosted by the University of Melbourne on Wednesday 8 October.

The University of Melbourne Extension Program provides high achieving Year 12 students the opportunity to study a first year university subject sequence while still at school. MATHS

Welcome to Term 4.

Year 7 Activities

Weeks of practicing to make '24' saw two of our Year 7 students participate in the intensely competitive but fun 24 Challenge® Maths Tournament, run at Monash University on 3 September, where more than 120 maths students from the Eastern Region competed for the honour of being the first ever 24 Challenge® Champions in Australia.

Brainy Days games and toys and the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development sponsored the event. Despite being a renowned event in the US for 20 years, this was the first time Australian students have experienced this event.

Based on the 24@ Game, 24 Challenge@ tournaments help to sharpen basic skills such as mental math, number sense, critical thinking, problem solving and pattern sensing. Justin MacDonald was very successful, receiving a Bronze Medal for his efforts on the day.

CAS-Nspire Calculators

Students entering into Year 10 and Year 11 Math Methods in 2009 have received a mail out with their Interim Reports, regarding the purchase of TI-Inspire CAS Calculators from the School in Term 4. Deposits have now been collected and the final payment is due at the end of October, after which a bulk order will be placed with the supplier and the calculators will be distributed to students. If you have not yet paid your deposit to secure a calculator for your student, you may still do so at the Office, but full payment is now required, as the time for deposits has passed. The cost for each calculator is \$185. The calculators are an absolute requirement for Methods and all students undertaking these courses are required to have one.

Year 12 Mathematics students in 2009 are required to have a TI-84. Please contact the Maths Coordinator if you have any questions regarding the calculator.

Lunch Time Classes

Lunch time catch up classes will commence on Thursday 9 October in Room 31. These will again run biweekly on Tuesdays and Thursdays every week. All students are welcome to attend and receive some extra assistance with Maths. Please encourage your student to attend these sessions, especially with the exam periods about to commence for students in Year 9 and above.

Year 12 students

These students are now completing their final assessment tasks in class and are heavily involved in revision in preparation for their final exams. After school classes are continuing for Further Maths students and are running on Thursdays from 3:00 pm to 4:00 pm in Room 16. The final one will be held next week on 16 October. Students are encouraged to attend these sessions to assist them with their revision.

New Text Books - 2009

E books have now been sourced for all Maths subjects for 2009 and added to the booklist. This is in support of the Notebook Program being introduced at Lilydale High School next year. Your student(s) will require either a hard copy or an e book version of the textbook appropriate to their year level. The e books are optional and will replace the hard copies that students currently have. The current pricing available indicates that the e books will be approximately half the cost of a new hard copy for each text book. However, students will still be required to purchase a home work book. Any questions may be directed to the Maths Coordinator.

What's been happening in Technology.....

The Year 11 Small Business Day held late last term, saw many Year 11 Business Management students needing fridge space, ovens, and microwaves. The Food Technology department provided a place to create their delicacies for the day.

There are 29 practical classes, some 628 students going through the three Food Technology kitchens each week and we are all being kept extremely busy. We are even using fresh herbs from our courtyard garden to complement our dishes.

VET students are excelling, and student feedback from Swinburne TAFE is all positive.

Jamie Le Rossignol's Vet Multimedia students are using the computer controlled CAD sign cutter to convert their Multimedia graphic logos into vinyl signs which have been mounted onto a variety of surfaces. The logos have been produced using Photoshop, Illustrator and Turbo Cad software.

Steve Peter's Year 10 VCE Design Technology students are designing and producing outdoor seating for Lilydale High School. The students formed groups of three or four, and decided on a company name and designated job responsibilities. They worked independently writing design briefs and submitting quotes to Mr Tully who originally briefed the students. Four designs were chosen for production after School Council approved the project. A plaque with the designers name will be mounted to their seat in recognition of their achievement. This unit was designed to expose students to "real life" scenarios to experience the advantages of true collaboration, and expose students to working for a real client, requiring accurate quotes, proposals and feedback.
